## THE SUPERIORITY OF JESUS

The inspired epistle to the Hebrews begins by emphasizing the eminent superiority of Jesus Christ, who is described as being "so much better than the angels" (Heb. 1:4, NKJV). Through the use of a series of quotations taken from fulfilled prophecies recorded in the Old Testament, the writer of Hebrews goes on to enumerate some of the key areas in which Jesus is superior, not only to the angels, but to all others. Hebrews 1:5-14 reads as follows:

For to which of the angels did He ever say: "You are My Son, today I have begotten You"? And again: "I will be to Him a Father, and He shall be to Me a Son"? But when He again brings the firstborn into the world, He says: "Let all the angels of

God worship Him.” And of the angels He says: “Who makes His angels spirits And His ministers a flame of fire.” But to the Son He says: “Your throne, O God, is forever and ever; a scepter of righteousness is the scepter of Your Kingdom. You have loved righteousness and hated lawlessness; therefore God, Your God, has anointed You with the oil of gladness more than Your companions.” And: “You, LORD, in the beginning laid the foundation of the earth, and the heavens are the work of Your hands. They will perish, but You remain; and they will all grow old like a garment; like a cloak You will fold them up, and they will be changed. But You are the same, and Your years will not fail.” But to which of the angels has He ever said: “Sit at My right hand, till I make Your enemies Your footstool”? Are they not all ministering spirits sent forth to minister for those who will inherit salvation?

Consider the following points which are stressed by the inspired writer of Hebrews in order to demonstrate the superiority of Jesus:

**1. He is the Son.** In contrast to the angels, God the Father has spoken concerning Jesus, saying, “You are My Son” (Heb. 1:5; cf. Psa. 2:7). While ordinary human beings are invited to become sons and daughters of God through the gospel (2 Cor. 6:17-18), Jesus is unique and superior to all others in His role as the Son of God. Of Jesus, John writes, “And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we beheld His glory, the glory as of the only begotten of the Father, full of grace and truth” (Jn. 1:14).

**2. He is worthy of worship.** Men, angels, and other created beings and objects are not to be worshiped (cf. Acts 10:25-26; Rev. 22:8-9; Rom. 1:22-25). But concerning Jesus, the Father has said, “Let all the angles of God worship Him” (Heb. 1:6). Jesus was worshiped at His birth (Matt. 2:11), during His earthly ministry (14:33), following His resurrection (28:9), and upon His ascension (Lk. 24:52).

**3. He is God.** Hebrews refers to the Son both as “God” (Heb. 1:8), and as the “LORD” who “in the beginning laid the foundation of the earth” (v. 10). While the Son is distinct from the Father and the Holy Spirit, He is just as much God as are the Father and the Spirit (cf. Matt. 28:18-20; 2 Cor. 13:14; Jn. 1:1-3). The apostle Paul wrote of Jesus, saying, “For in Him dwells all the fullness of the Godhead bodily” (Col. 2:9).

**4. He is reigning.** Unlike the angels, the Father has said to the Son, “Sit at My right hand, till I make your enemies Your footstool” (Heb. 1:13; cf. Psa. 110:1). Jesus is currently reigning on the throne of God in heaven as King of kings and Lord of lords (Rev. 3:21; 19:16), and will continue reigning over His spiritual kingdom until the end of time. As Paul writes, “For He must reign till He has put all enemies under His feet” (1 Cor. 15:25).

Conclusion

Jesus said, “All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth” (Matt. 28:18). Have you submitted your life to the King of kings?
