## HOLY, HOLY, HOLY

"...one called out to another and said, "Holy, Holy, Holy, is the LORD Of hosts, The whole earth is full of His glory." And the foundations of the thresholds trembled at the voice of him who called out, while the temple was filling with smoke. Then I said, "Woe is me, for I am ruined! Because I am a man of unclean lips, And I live among a people of unclean lips; For my eyes have seen the King, the LORD of hosts"" (Is. 6:3-5).

Our whole orientation is wrong if we come to Christ to feel better about ourselves.

His sacrifice proves how much He loves us, and gives us a sense of worth we would not otherwise have. But He did not come to send everyone on an eternal ego trip.

We should fall before Him in humility. It is the self-righteous who proudly stand upright before God.

Godly men of old were filled with dread and wonder at the holiness of God.

They became keenly aware of their own insignificance, and convicted of their sin in the light of God's holiness.

"The Bible says that God is holy, holy, holy. Not that He is merely holy, or even holy, holy. He is holy, holy, holy. The Bible never says that God is love, love, love, or mercy, mercy, mercy, or wrath, wrath, wrath, or justice, justice, justice. It does say that He is holy, holy, holy, the whole earth is full of His glory." –R. C. Sproul

When the Bible calls God holy it means primarily that God is transcendently superior, distinct, and separate from everything and everyone.

When we read, "just as He who called you is holy, so be holy in all you do, for it is written: 'Be holy, because I am holy'" (1 Pet. 1:15-16), it means our holiness must reflect the holiness of God. Though we are not God, we are to mirror His holy character.

His love is holy love, His mercy is holy mercy, His justice is holy justice, his knowledge is holy knowledge, His name is holy, His Word is holy, etc.

When the word holy is applied to God, it does not signify one single attribute, it encompasses all that He is. He is holy in every aspect, and He is proved holy by what He does: "the LORD Almighty will be exalted by his justice, and the holy God will be proved holy by his righteous acts" (Is. 5:16).

If we do not understand God's holiness, we cannot have the proper reverence for Him, nor can we be holy ourselves. Holiness is perfected only through reverence for God (2 Cor. 7:1)

Irreverence is a fatal malady—just ask Moses. Striking the rock at Meribah was an act of disobedience, called out by God for his unbelief due to—you guessed it—irreverence (Num 20:12-13).

Moses was sincere, but irreverent. They are not the same thing. Genuine reverence for God always manifests in obedience—"...if you call on him as Father who judges impartially according to each one's deeds, CONDUCT yourselves with REVERENCE throughout the time of your exile..." (1 Pet. 1:17).

Too many fail to take God's holiness seriously. It is not to be trifled with, tested, mocked, or diminished.

Approved examples in Scripture who recognized God's holiness were humble, fearful, reverent, and worshipful people.
