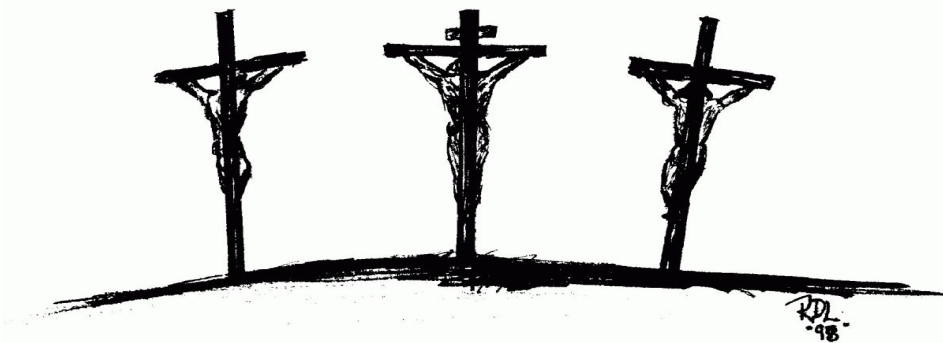

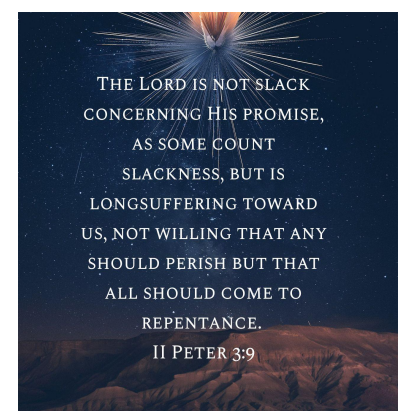

## **GOD CARES**

In Psalm 10 David complains to the LORD. He falsely believes the LORD is not paying attention to him. And he complains about the ungodly. He notes that, from a human perspective, the ungodly prospers despite renouncing the LORD, despite not seeking God, and not even allowing God to enter his thoughts (vv. 3, 4). The ungodly sneers at God and his fellow man (v. 5), believes he is "bullet proof" and will never suffer adversity (v. 6), and his tongue is always "full of cursing and deceit" (v. 7). The ungodly constantly devises evil plots against the righteous and oppresses them with evil words and schemes (vv. 7-10).

The ungodly are so arrogant they believe "God has forgotten; He hides His face; He will never see" (v. 11). The ungodly falsely believes God will never hold them accountable for their deeds (v. 13). David calls on the LORD to remember the righteous and repay the ungodly with their just deserts. I think all who strive to live according to God's will and word can identify with David's lament and feelings. But we must never forget that the LORD knows and sees all, and He truly cares about righteousness and holiness (cf. Psa. 139).

The LORD hears the cries of the righteous as they are oppressed by the ungodly and keeps their tears in His bottle and records their oppressions in His book (Psa. 56:8). The ungodly are sadly mistaken and totally misread God. They believe God does not take immediate action because He either does not exist or He does not care. They totally discount His coming and holding them responsible. But the reality is "The Lord is not slack concerning His promise, as some count slackness, but is longsuffering toward us, not willing that any should perish but that all should come to repentance." (2 Pet. 3:9) The LORD's inaction is in reality a display of His love and longsuffering. Make no mistake! One great day, every man/woman MUST "appear before the judgment seat of Christ, that each one may receive the things done in the body, according to what he has done, whether good or bad" (2 Cor. 5:10). There will be a great "final accounting"! All wrongs will be made right! The righteous will be rewarded and the ungodly will be "cast into the lake of fire" (Rev. 20:15) "which is the second death" (Rev. 21:8). They will suffer eternal separation from God and all that is good, while the righteous will live forever in His blessed presence. You can "take that to the bank"! How did Paul react to that prospect? Note what he wrote in 2 Corinthians 5:11a: "Knowing, therefore, the terror of the Lord, we persuade men..." Let us all be persuaded and abandon ungodliness and pursue righteousness!
